Additionally, AMF is honored to announce a collaboration with [The Rainwater Charitable Foundation](#) (RCF) for 2024. This year's AMF grant will be made in partnership with RCF, thus amplifying AMF's granting dollars while providing priority access to the best scientific research projects designed to find the cause of Alzheimer's and dementia related illness. The partnership will award up to \$2 million total to the grant recipients.

The Rainwater Charitable Foundation was founded by Texas billionaire Richard Rainwater in 1991. In 2009, the foundation created the [Tau Consortium](#) as a dedicated medical research program after Mr. Rainwater was diagnosed with progressive supranuclear palsy (PSP). Sadly, Mr. Rainwater passed away from PSP complications in 2015, but the RCF has continued to privately fund over \$130 million worth of neurodegenerative disease research. The RCF strives to convene and support the top Alzheimer's and dementia researchers in the world through programs like the Tau Consortium, the Rainwater Prize Program, and the newly launched Tauopathy Challenge Workshop.
